

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure 2014-15

The government has increased the amount of Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) it has devolved to schools from £900 in 2013-14 to £1,300 per pupil for 2014-15. There is therefore a significant emphasis on schools to ensure there is no gap between the attainment of children in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant within the school and those nationally.

Nature of Support

The funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:-

- To provide targeted support in Reading, Writing and Maths, as a 'catch-up' programme for all PP children not on track to reach their FFTD targets.
- To provide 'Safe Space' counselling support for children experiencing emotional and or attachment difficulties
- To train staff in the use of 'Nessy' to improve rates of progress in phonics and spelling for vulnerable pupils and those entitled to PPG
- To fund places on school trips- to ensure all pupils are able to participate in school trips which are part of the curriculum
- To purchase additional resources to engage pupils and improve rates of progress.

Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium Grant spending

- Are all PP children on track to reach their FFTD targets in Reading, Writing and Maths?
- Have the children receiving 'Safe Space' engaged with the counsellor?
- Are all children able to access Nessy?
- Have all children attended school trips that are part of the curriculum?

Progress towards targets set for the cohort 2013/4

It is important to note that of the ten children in the school, triggering PPG, four also have Special Educational Needs or Safeguarding concerns.

Reading

The two Year 6 pupils receiving the PPG reached their FFTD targets in Reading. Five out of seven remaining pupils in KS2 are on track to achieve their FFTD targets.

Writing

The two Year 6 pupils receiving the PPG both reached their FFTD targets in Writing. Four out of the seven remaining pupils in KS2 are on track to achieve their FFTD targets. These not on track are receiving regular targeted support

Maths

The two Year 6 pupils receiving the PPG exceeded their FFTD targets in Maths. All but one child in KS2 is on track to reach their FFTD targets.

Emotional Well-being

All children who have received counselling have engaged well with the learning process and the counsellor and attend school regularly.

Nessy

We now have a multi-user licence for use of Nessy. All staff are trained in its use. All children have completed the base line assessment and are using the programme on a regular basis as an intervention programme

Educational Visits

All children attended the educational visits arranged by the class teacher. The PPG was used to support four of the eleven children to access these visits.
